- Building further resilience into the skills system





# The South Essex Estuary (SEE) Park Vision: More Than a Park...

South Essex will offer an extraordinary parkland setting, providing an attractive offer for modern living, that supports residents, businesses, industry, tourism, and leisure activities. A single park system framing all of South Essex, will perform as a model of adaptability and resilience, holistically addressing 21st century challenges through its green and blue spaces, including:


- improved health, well-being, and air quality

- transitioning to net zero carbon, providing carbon-offsetting
- eco-tourism and green tech job creation and recovery





# SEE Park – a scaled response to our green growth ambition...

- a network of natural landscapes totaling 23,000 ha.
- 16,000 ha. of which will be new green spaces, creating greater accessibility for local residents
- 9,200 ha. of newly planted woodlands, achieving significant carbon offsetting, improved air quality, and open spaces
- 13,800 ha. of restored marshlands, substantially improving biodiversity net gains while providing waterfront access for residents' enjoyment
- naturally addressing flood management across 12,500 ha, protecting homes, businesses and infrastructure from flood risks

SEE Park is planned around existing and proposed developments.


The Park does not conflict with development, but rather supports it, and enhances property values.

- Brentwood Parklands
- Mardyke Valley
- Central Thames Marshlands
- Woodland Arc
- Island Wetlands



## **Key Headlines**

- £5.1 billion additional GVA
- Over £4.5 billion in new public and private investment
- 25,000+ new jobs with many more across supply chains, with significant investment in training and skills
- 1,700 acres of development land much with planning consent
- £400 million port investment into some of the most deprived areas
- 20% of the UK's most deprived communities are in London and the South-East





### **Key Features**

- Close alignment to Government, SELEP, ASELA and Thames Estuary Growth Board Priorities through TC / ASELA engagement
- Sites at London Gateway, Port of Tilbury, Thames Enterprise Park and Ford's Dagenham plant
- Levelling Up and Regeneration: innovative and targeted approach to deprived communities and investment to equip local workforce with the skills required to access Freeport jobs
- Innovation Hub: using catalytic impact of Thames Freeport to support collaboration, R&D and positive spill-overs across advanced manufacturing, advanced logistics and clean energy

### Investment

- £4.5bn public and private sector investment
- Retained business rates gives Thurrock Council opportunity to invest £300m in projects to accelerate levelling-up outcomes (subject to business case):
  - Active Travel between existing communities, new communities and across South Essex (Canvey Link)
  - Community Investment health and wellbeing improvements, as well as education investment to ensure local residents have access to new high-quality jobs
  - Multi-modal Travel improvements to rail and river infrastructure (supporting net-zero)
  - Infrastructure to Unlock Growth new roads and upgrades to existing network
  - Digital and Green expansion of high speed internet and enabling the hydrogen opportunity
